Unemployment (continued)

As noted from the South Carolina Department of Employment and Workforce:

While Congress has passed the **Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act**, which aims to help workers and businesses suffering due to COVID-19, South Carolina is currently waiting to find out when that money will be dispersed to our state systems.

SCDEW (Employment and Workforce) officials stated if you have been furloughed or laid off due to COVID-19, you are able and willing to work, you should qualify for benefits.

That being said, if you can't work because you are in quarantine or have to stay home to care for a child due to schools being closed -- then you are technically not willing and able to work. This will likely result in your application being denied, and self-employed individuals will also likely not be eligible for unemployment benefits through the state. However, once the CARE Act funds are dispersed to SC, then self employed individuals should receive benefits.

If someone cannot file their claim due to a social security number issue, they will need to reach out to SCDEW via their TelClaim number, (866) 831-1724. Please note that weekly unemployment checks range from \$289.00 a week to the state's maximum of \$326.00 a week.

The Comet has noted the following changes to accommodate social distancing standards while operating to serve the public:

- Operating on a Saturday schedule (Monday-Saturday) with the Sunday schedule unchanged.
- Closing COMET Central until further notice to alleviate overcrowding concerns.
- Offering *free* fares for essential travel. This includes travel for necessary services/supplies, medical reasons, to care for the elderly, minors and people with disabilities and for travel related to work or those providing other necessary functions.
- Implementing social distancing policies like distance seating of every other seat, limiting bus capacity and rear boarding. Prohibiting use of the handrails.
- Taking extra safety measures with security officers on hand and strict enforcement on loitering.
- Daily disinfecting and deep cleaning of all buses and facilities.
